

English-language literature on South Tyrol: a comprehensive bibliography

South Tyrol is an autonomous, predominantly German-speaking province in Italy that was annexed from the former Austro-Hungarian Empire in 1920. This report is a comprehensive bibliography of English-language literature that substantively addresses legal or political aspects of South Tyrol's demographic diversity and autonomy arrangement. It includes 203 different sources, published between 1927 and 2015, ranging from journal articles to doctoral dissertations.
